

Lower Key Stage 2- Lost and Found Home Learning planning


Here is a selection of ideas, please choose a few ideas that are suitable for your children and the resources you have at home.

Geography

- Discuss differing animals from different habitats
- Make a list of animals that live in the desert, snow, rainforest and woodlands.
- Compare the animals above. What makes them different, are there any similarities. What do they eat? How have humans made an impact on the differing environments?

Art/DT

- Hand-painting and foot-painting and make into animals
- Create animals from differing environments, snow, rainforest, woodlands, desert.

- Count forwards and backwards in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's, use resources to support.

English
